Submitting Poster Abstracts and One-Page Poster Summary

Poster Viewing

Posters will be available for viewing each afternoon of the Conference, at the Pier 5 Hotel (venue for afternoon sessions). Please plan to pin up your poster as early as Tuesday afternoon and no later than early on Wednesday afternoon. Poster introductions will be given on Wednesday afternoon. Please plan to be present at the formal poster viewing immediately following the introduction. All posters must be removed by 3 PM on Thursday.

Poster Display Panels, Mounting and Support Equipment/Configuration

Each poster must be constructed to not exceed **8' (wide) by 4' (tall), with 4' by 4' preferred**.

Posters will be mounted to a double-sided panel that is 8' wide by 4' tall, such that one large (up to 8'x4') or two smaller (4'x4') posters can be displayed on each side of the panel. These panels have a horizontal orientation. The top edge of the panel is approximately seven feet above the floor. The bottom edge is about three feet above the floor. Your poster will be displayed with conference-supplied pushpins. Final guidance, including assignment information, will be emailed by 13 November and will also be available at the registration table.

Some Pointers for Poster Presentations

Formatting Guidelines/Suggestions

Place the title at the top center of the poster. Use 72 point letters. Avoid hand drawn materials. Keep it simple. Make sure it has a logical flow. Use color, graphics, charts, and photos. Key points should be in large type. Do not try to tell the entire story on the panel. Save some key points for one-on-one discussion.
